## Camp Regulations and Policies

Camp Kulaqua is a Christian camp owned and operated by the Seventh-day Adventist Church for the purpose of providing a Christian summer camp atmosphere. Church membership is not required, although it is understood that those who attend will uphold the standards of the Seventh-day Adventist Church. Camp Kulaqua is committed to providing a safe atmosphere where campers can enjoy summer camp without the interference from worldly influences. In striving to accomplish this mission we have set forth camper policies to give boundaries and standards for campers to follow. It is understood that when a camper chooses not to abide by the camp policies, they may be asked to leave with no refund.

### Camp policies include:

- Campers are expected to obey their counselors and the summer camp staff.
- Campers are to be on-time and attend the scheduled activities and programs.
- Campers are to let their counselors know where they are at all times.
- Campers are to show respect to other campers and staff.
- Campers are to show respect to the camp property and not deface it in any way.
- Campers are to behave in a Christian manner.

### The following will not be allowed, and may result in the camper being sent home:

- Violence towards other campers or staff (verbal or physical)
- Sexual misconduct
- Entering opposite sex cabin
- Possessing any tobacco product
- Possessing any alcoholic beverage
- Possession of narcotics or Non-Prescription drugs
- Possession of cell phones
- Possession of any form of weapon
- Breaking the law as set forth by the state of Florida
- Wearing inappropriate clothing (miniskirts, bikinis, spaghetti straps, halter tops, short shorts, clothing that exposes undergarments, etc.)
- Use of foul language or gestures
- Disrespect toward others or destruction of camp property
- Repeated misbehavior or disobedience
